NRS 387.114 - Breakfast after the Bell 2019-2020 School Year Final Report





Signed into law by Governor Brian Sandoval in 2015, Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 387.114, also known as Breakfast after the Bell (BAB), required all Nevada schools with 70 percent or greater free/reduced lunch eligibility implement an option for students to have access to breakfast after the start of the school day. The bill also set aside \$2 million in grant money to assist in implementation over two years, from 2015-2017. Since school year (SY) 2017, implementation costs are absorbed by the School Food Authority for all new and existing eligible schools.

BREAKFAST IN BAB SCHOOLS


NUMBER OF BAB APPROVED SCHOOLS'

77% of school sites met or exceeded their participation goals in SY2019-2020°

- 1: School year (SY) is defined as July 1 June 30.
- 2: Eligible students are self-reported by School Food Authorities (SFAs) in monthly claims.
- 3: Data based on September 1 May 30 meal claims each year.
- 4: Breakfasts include all breakfasts served (free, reduced and paid) both before and after the start of the school day.
- 5: Data for school year 2019-2020 was impacted by school closures from March 16, 2020 through the remainder of the school year due to COVID-19, during which time many school sites did not serve breakfast through the BAB program.
