2023- Q1

EXPORTS BY YEAR AND QUARTER

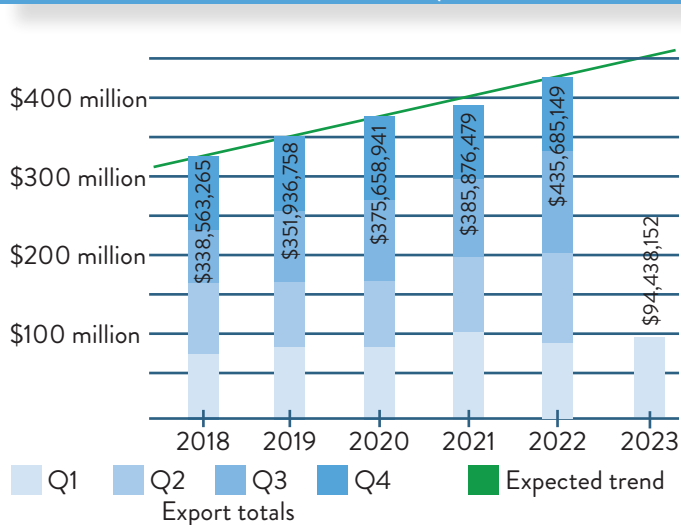
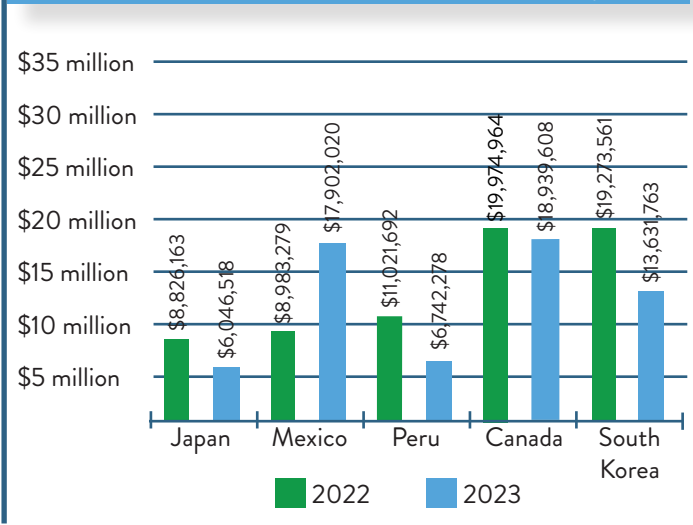
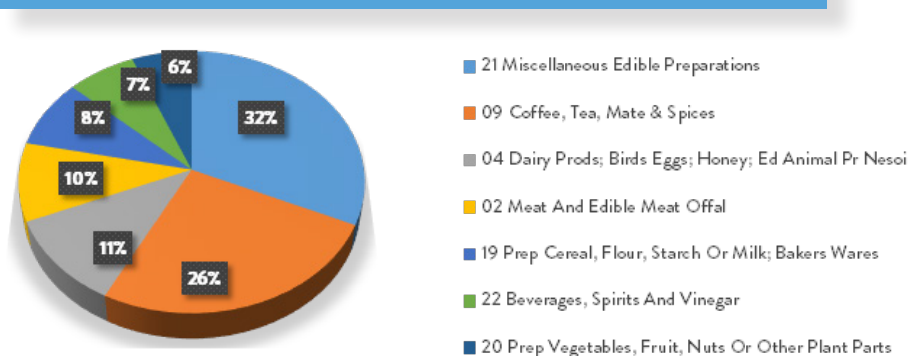

Nevada's food and agriculture exports were \$94 million in the first quarter (Q1) of 2023 (January-March), nearly the same as in Q1 of 2022, with a \$413,000 increase. Canada was Nevada's largest trading partner in Q1, accounting for 3% of total exports from the state during the quarter. Comparing the first quarters of 2023 and 2022, trade with Mexico grew primarily due to a \$15 million increase in meat/edible meat offal and miscellaneous edible preparations.

FIGURE 3: COMMODITY EXPORT BREAK DOWN



In Nevada, the sales of miscellaneous edible preparations, coffee, tea, mate and spices generated \$47 million. The two highest grossing exports for Nevada in Q1 of 2023 were miscellaneous edible preparations reaching \$26 million and coffee, tea, mate and spices reaching \$21 million.
