# **REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS**

The Nevada Department of Agriculture announces the availability of funding for invasive plant management projects that benefit sage-grouse and Nevada rangelands. This is a formal request for proposals for 2014-2015 season projects.

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#### Amount of Funding Available: \$85,000

Award Period: August 11, 2014 – December 15, 2015

#### Applicant Eligibility:

- Open to any federal, state, or local government entities, Cooperative Weed Management Areas (CWMA), Conservation Districts (CD), Weed District (WD), or private party (provided that they are an LLC or INC).
- Applicant must have a mechanism for receiving, documenting and reporting on funds and activities in place. Reporting accurate financial records is required.
- Applicant must not be in default on any other contracts or grants with the Nevada Department of Agriculture.

#### Additional Project/Funding Criteria:

- The project must focus on control or removal of noxious or invasive plants.
- Pre and post monitoring of the project area by collecting before and after pictures and basic vegetation community data throughout the life of the project is required.

- Funding expenditures to support invasive plant management activities can be used for the following: materials and supplies, and labor (direct or contractual) for on-the-ground activities.
- Match contributions are not required but are desired.
- Administrative overhead/indirect charges cannot exceed 10%
- Project site data must be encompassed into EDDMaps in statewide weed database.
- Site must be entirely or partially within the state of Nevada and can be used on any land ownership type.

**PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS:** Proposals will be scored and awarded on a competitive basis. See Attachment A for proposal scoring criteria. Projects may be fully or partially funded.

- VI. Project Site Description
  - Location and size
  - Land ownership
  - Sage-grouse habitat and agricultural use type

- Targeted invasive plants
- VII. Work Plan Planned Activities
  - How will you use this funding on-the-ground?
  - What is the estimated time frame for on-the-ground activities and overall project?
  - Weed control strategies to be used (mowing, hand pull, herbicides, grazing, etc.) How is integrated vegetation management being implemented?
  - What are your plans for re-vegetation to achieve restoration?
  - What technologies will be used in data collection and mapping?
  - What monitoring techniques will be used to measure success and vegetation changes?
