



NEVADA FOOD AND AGRICULTURE TRADE REPORT


2022- Q3

The Nevada Department of Agriculture (NDA) works with key trade partners, stakeholders and policy makers to ensure that the food and agriculture sector continues to see economic growth. To ensure that industry and partners are up-to-date, the NDA issues quarterly trade reports in addition to the in-depth biennium report. Inflation is adjusted using U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index Inflation Calculator for each previous year to 2022.





During the third quarter (Q3) of 2022 (July-August), Nevada's food and agricultural exports totaled \$120.5 million, a moderate increase over the previous quarter. This quarter was higher than both Q2 of 2022 (\$117.5 million) and the export average for Q3 in 2019-2022 (\$97 million). South Korea was the top trading partner for Q3, with exports to the country accounting for 2.5% of total food and agriculture exports from Nevada. Trade with South Korea was elevated in Q3 2022 compared to 2021, primarily due to a \$13 million increase in exports of coffee, tea and spices.



In total, dairy goods, coffee, tea, mate and spices accounted for \$65 million in Nevada sales. From the second to the third quarter of 2022, exports of dairy products, bird eggs, and Ed Animal Pr Nesoi increased by \$7 million.
