EXPORTS BY YEAR AND QUARTER

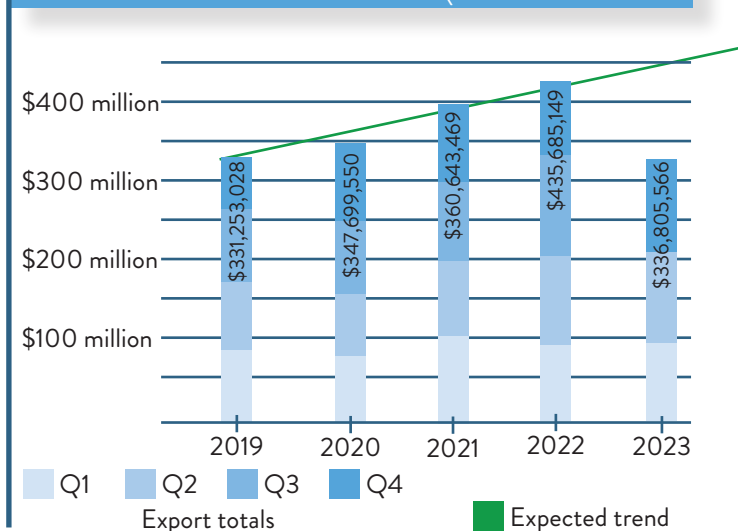
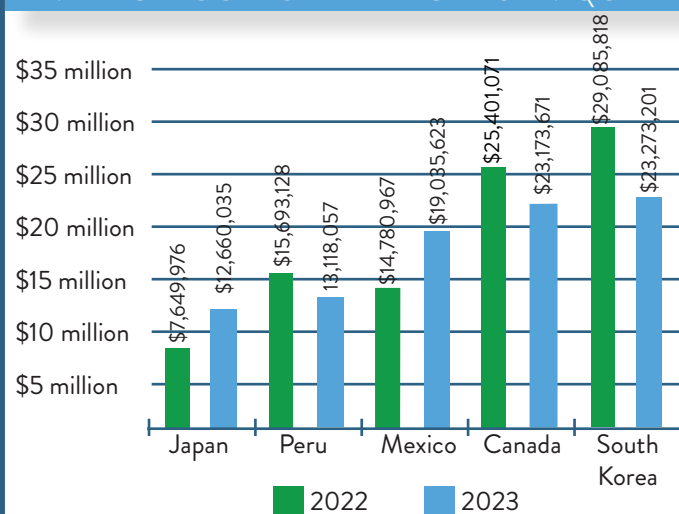
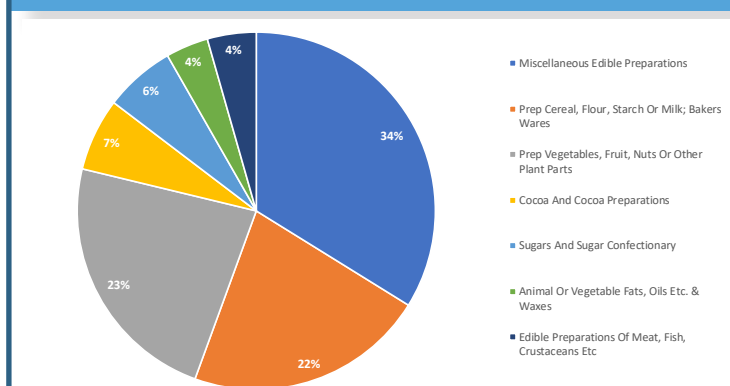


FIGURE 2:

In the third quarter (Q3) of 2023 (July-September), Nevada’s food and agriculture exports were \$125 million, with an increase of \$8 million from the previous quarter. South Korea was Nevada’s largest trading partner in Q3, accounting for 17% of world total exports from the state during the quarter. Comparing the third quarters of 2023 and 2022, trade with Mexico grew primarily due to a meat and edible offal.

In Nevada, the sale of miscellaneous edible preparations generated \$38 million, leading Q3. The second highest-grossing export for Nevada in Q3 was prep cereal, flour, starch, or milk; bakers wares at \$27 million, followed by prep vegetables, fruits, nuts or other plant parts at \$17 million in third.
