NEVADA JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW SCHOLARSHIP

Application Requirements:

Applicants must be a senior in high school at the time of the application.

Applicants must currently be exhibiting at the Show, plus have at least one year of previous participation in the Show.

Applicants must provide a transcript of grades and have a minimum unweighted Grade Point Average of 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 (4.0 = A). ACT or SAT scores may be considered, so the applicant must provide them.

To apply for the Scholarship, the following must be received via email at <u>NJLSB@agri.nv.gov</u>. All documentation must be received by <u>April 1st.</u>

1. Completed Official Nevada Junior Livestock Show Scholarship Application:

This is a writable digital Scholarship Application available at <u>http://agri.nv.gov/ADMINISTRATION/NJLSB/NJLSB</u>. After completing the online form, you can save the document locally and email it with supporting documents.

- 2. ACT or SAT scores -Unless waived by the institution that the student is applying to.
- 3. Resume
- 4. Photo: small snapshot or school photo
- 5. Transcripts of grades:
- 6. Essay:

Include a summary of Leadership Activities, Community and Citizenship Activities, School Activities, NJLS Achievements, and Career Objectives.

7. Letter of Recommendation: by a non-relative

Some, but not necessarily all, applicants will be interviewed for Scholarships before the Show.

The Scholarship Committee shall have the discretion to address extenuating circumstances regarding applicants.

The amount and number of Scholarships to be determined are based on funds available. Each Scholarship is a one-time award. For each Scholarship awarded in the amount of \$1000 or more, one-half of the award will be distributed in each of two successive semesters or quarters, provided the below criteria are met. Scholarships less than \$1000 will be made in one payment, provided the below criteria are met.

Not all applicants may receive a Scholarship.

Scholarship Requirements:

Scholarship recipients may attend any accredited post-secondary institution (2-year or 4-year college, university, or trade/professional school).

For the initial scholarship disbursement, recipients must provide verification of full-time, paid enrollment. (12 units or more for the first semester) and a transcript of their first-semester college credits with a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale to the Board. Transcripts must include the student's name and student I.D. number.

For the second disbursement, recipients must provide proof of full-time to the NJLS Board, paid enrollment (12 units or more for the second semester), and a transcript of their second-semester college credits with a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale to the Board. Transcripts must include the student's name and student I.D. number.
