Applicants may use ½ page each, double-spaced, typed or computer generated to answer the questions below:

Applicants may use ½ page, double spaced, typed or computer generated to describe any specific circumstances (personal, medical, etc.) which you think the Scholarship Committee should know or which would affect you or your family's ability to finance a college education.

Applicants may use one page, double-spaced, typed or computer generated to write an essay that discusses how involvement in the Nevada Junior Livestock Show has influenced your life.

Submit all Application forms and accompanying documents by **April 11th** to the Nevada Junior Livestock Show Board.

Nevada Junior Livestock Show Scholarship

Application Requirements:

Applicants must be a senior in high school at the time of application.

Applicants must currently be exhibiting at the Nevada Junior Livestock Show, plus have at least one year previous participation in the Nevada Junior Livestock Show.

Applicants must provide a transcript of grades and have a minimum unweighted Grade Point Average of 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 (4.0 = A). ACT or SAT scores may be considered, so must be provided by the applicant.

To apply for this scholarship the following must be received in the NJLSB office postmarked by **April 11th** :

- A completed Nevada Junior Livestock Show Scholarship Application
- A one to two page resume with photo (small snapshot or school photo)
- Transcript of grades
- ACT or SAT scores
- Essay

Some, but not necessarily all, applicants will be interviewed for this scholarship prior to or at the Nevada Junior Livestock Show. It is possible not all applicants interviewed will receive a scholarship.

The Scholarship Committee shall have the discretion to address extenuating circumstances regarding applicants.

The amount and number of scholarships to be determined based on funds available. Each scholarship is a one-time award. Each scholarship will be a minimum of \$500.00. For each scholarship one half of the award will be distributed in each of two successive semesters or quarters, provided the below criteria are met.

Scholarship Requirements:

Scholarship recipients may attend any accredited post-secondary institution (2-year or 4-year; college, university or trade/professional school).

For the initial scholarship disbursement, recipients must enroll within 1.5 years of being awarded the scholarship and provide verification of full-time enrollment (12 units or more for the first semester) and a transcript of their first semester college credits with a minimum of GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale to the NJLSB, along with a receipt of class fees paid for that period. All items submitted must have recipient's name on the documents, student I.D. numbers will not be accepted.

For the second disbursement, recipients must provide to the NJLSB proof of full time enrollment (12 units or more for the second semester) and a transcript of their second semester college credits with a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale to the NJLSB, along with a receipt of class fees paid for that period. All items submitted must have recipient's name on the documents, student I.D. numbers will not be accepted.

Recipients failing to meet all award requirements will forfeit the award.
