Here are some tips on how you can use these resources:

School Meal Pattern Brochures

These informational brochures can be used to provide parents, teachers, and members of the public with basic information about the meal pattern requirements. Take these brochures to School Board, PTA, or parent meetings to share information about the new meal pattern. They can also be used by staff to provide information about what foods are included in each component group.

School Meal Pattern Posters

The meal pattern posters can be used in the school cafeteria and classroom to show what foods are included in each component group. Display these posters near your menu to show how you are offering foods from each of the components!

School Meal Pattern Magnets

Magnets can be handed out to parents, teachers, and administrators to help reinforce your messages on healthy eating and smart learning!

School Meal Pattern Dry Erase Menu Boards

The menu boards can be used to meet the federal signage requirements. These boards are dry erase, which will allow site staff to enter what menu items are available as part of a reimbursable meal each day.
