### NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

#### Notice of Hearing for the Amendment of Regulations of the Nevada Department of Agriculture

The Nevada Department of Agriculture will hold a public hearing on Thursday, October 17, 2013, at Agriculture Headquarters, 405 South 21<sup>st</sup> Street, Sparks, NV 89431; Phone: (775) 353-3601. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the Amendment of regulations that pertain to chapter 586 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

The purpose is to solicit public comments from interested persons on the following proposed regulation: NAC 586.011; *a regulation relating to pesticides; increasing the amount of the annual fee to register a pesticide; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.*

The fee increase is needed to continue working efficiently and effectively by supporting administration, education, training, laboratory operations, investigation and enforcement and other pesticide programmatic related activities.

The intent of this amendment is to increase the annual registration fee each registrant must pay from \$100 to \$125 for each pesticide registered.

The estimated economic effect of the regulation on businesses which it is to regulate and on the public are as follows:

a) Adverse Effects: An additional \$25 per year per product is a minimal increase; Nevada remains the second lowest pesticide registration fee of all surrounding states. The fees will increase the cost to businesses, but will not cause an active business to go out of business. There is no adverse effect on the public.

b) Beneficial effects: Businesses will benefit from the continued efficient and effective service provided by the pesticide enforcement program. The public will benefit from consistent enforcement of regulations to ensure public safety as it pertains to pesticide usage in the state.

A concerted effort was made to determine the impact of the proposed regulation on small businesses. Staff in the pesticide program and administration division determined that the \$25 increase is of minimal effect.

There will be no additional cost to the Nevada Department of Agriculture for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

The proposed regulation will not overlap or duplicate any regulations set by federal, state or local governmental agencies.

The proposed regulation is not required by federal law.

The proposed regulation does not include any provisions more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity.

The proposed regulation increases an existing fee.
