European corn borer (Ostinia nubilalis) NAC 554.230	Plants and cut flowers, aster, chrysanthemum, calendula, cosmos, dahlia (except tubers without stems), gladiolus (except corms without stems), hollyhock, marigold, zinnia, Japanese hop, rhubarb plants	All states <u>except C</u> A,OR, WA, ID, UT, AK, AZ, FL, HI, NM	Certificate of quarantine compliance required from all except those listed at left.
Japanese beetle (Popillia japonica) NAC 554.162	Soil, humus, compost, manure (except commercially packed), grass sod, crowns or roots used for propagation (except soil free), and any other plant, plant part, article, or means of conveyance presenting a hazard of spreading Japanese beetle.	CT, DE, GA, IL, IN, KY, MD, ME, MA, MS, MI, NH, NJ, NY, NC, OH, OK, PA, RI, SC, TN, TX, VT, VA, WV, AL, KS, MN, MO, WI, Canadian provinces of Quebec and Ontario.	Phytosanitary certificate required per US Domestic Japanese Beetle Harmonization Plan for all areas covered under quarantine. Nevada is a Category 1 state under the plan. The controls listed below may or may not comply with the U.S. Domestic Japanese Beetle Narmonization plan or with FIFRA. Lethal Yellowing of Palm (causative organism) and the plant hopper Myndus crudus NAC 554.535	Susceptible palm trees, screw pine, and hosts of <i>Myndus crudus</i> (the vector of lethal yellowing of palm), and all parts capable of propagation, except seed, are the articles and commodities covered. See text of quarantine for specific commodities.	Florida counties of Broward, Collier, Dade, Hendry, Lee, Martin, Monroe and Palm Beach; and Cameron, Hidalgo and Willacy in the state of <b>Texas</b>	The entry into Nevada of a commodity specified in the quarantine is prohibited if grown or shipped from an area under quarantine. A commodity that enters this state in violation of the quarantine must be immediately shipped to a destination outside of this state or destroyed by burning or other manner approved by the department
Mint disease (Verticillium albo atrum) & the nematode (Longidorus sylphus Thorn) NAC 554.480	Any species of the genus Mentha that may be used for the production of oil.	All states and territories of the U.S.	Does not apply to containerized nursery stock. Permit required for shipment of propagative material intended for commercial production of oil.
Mint stem borer (Pseudobaris nigrina) NAC 554.525	Any species of the genus Mentha that may be used for the production of mint oil.	Prohibited if from AL, CT, FL,MA,NJ,NY,NC,PA,RI,SC,VA, Malheur Co. in OR, the counties of Payette, Canyon, Ada, Gem, Washington, Owyhee, and Elmore in ID. Restricted from all other states or portions of states.	Does not apply to containerized nursery stock. Certificate of quarantine compliance required for shipments of propagative material intended for production of oil from restricted states. Prohibited from all others as shown.

Stem and bulb nematode (Ditylenchus dipsaci) White rot fungus (Sclerotium cepivorum) NAC 554.910	Propagative bulbs, cloves, sets or seedlings of garlic, onion, and other <i>Allium</i> species	All states and the District of Columbia	Applied only to regulated articles to be used for <b>commercial production</b> . Does not apply to materials offered for sale for home use.
