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APPLICATION FOR PRODUCER'S CERTIFICATE 2013-2014 SEASON

Enclosed is an application for a producer certificate. Return the completed application and the required \$50.00 fee to the address shown at the bottom of the application. Once your application is processed an inspector will visit your farm to verify the information you provided on the application. **Crops not in the ground at the time of the inspection will not be listed on the certificate. Plan ahead and send in your application at a time when most of the crops you want to certify are planted.** Your certificate will be issued after the inspection has occurred. If you grow additional crops and want them listed on the certificate you will need to submit an application to amend your certificate.

For some crops, it is not necessary to list every species of plant. For example, if you grow cut flowers, you do not have to list every species. Simply enter "Cut Flowers". The same is true for herbs – "Herbs, various" will do. Vegetables should be listed by kind (for example: summer squash, winter squash, sweet corn, broom corn, pickling cucumber, slicing cucumber) but is not necessary to list the particular variety (such as "Ronde de Nice Zucchini" or "Waltham Butternut Squash"). Perennial crops such as fruit trees and vine crops must be listed by variety ("Braeburn" or "Golden Delicious" apples for example)

Attach a map to locate your farm from the nearest town, intersection, highway, county road or state route. Also include alternate phone or other contact numbers when applicable.

We will make every effort to process your certificate and get it back to you as quickly as possible. It takes at least ten working days to process the certificate, so please plan ahead.

As a reminder, the certificate can only be used to represent crops you have grown.
