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Producer guidelines

- **Producer certificate requirements**

- Actual producer of farm products
- Raw produce, eggs (all types) and honey
- Growing or producing in Nevada
 - Row crops, fruit trees, etc
 - Hydroponics and aquaponics
 - Sprouts and microgreens
 - Mushrooms

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Producer guidelines

- **Producer certificate requirements**
 - Must list all products that are being grown/produced
 - Cannot be used to represent another farms product



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Produce vendor guidelines

- **Produce vendor requirements**
 - Must state on application all products that are being sold in Nevada
 - Must maintain a list of all producers/wholesalers/etc. that you purchase from for the last 12 months
 - Must display your certificate at point of sale

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Produce vendor guidelines

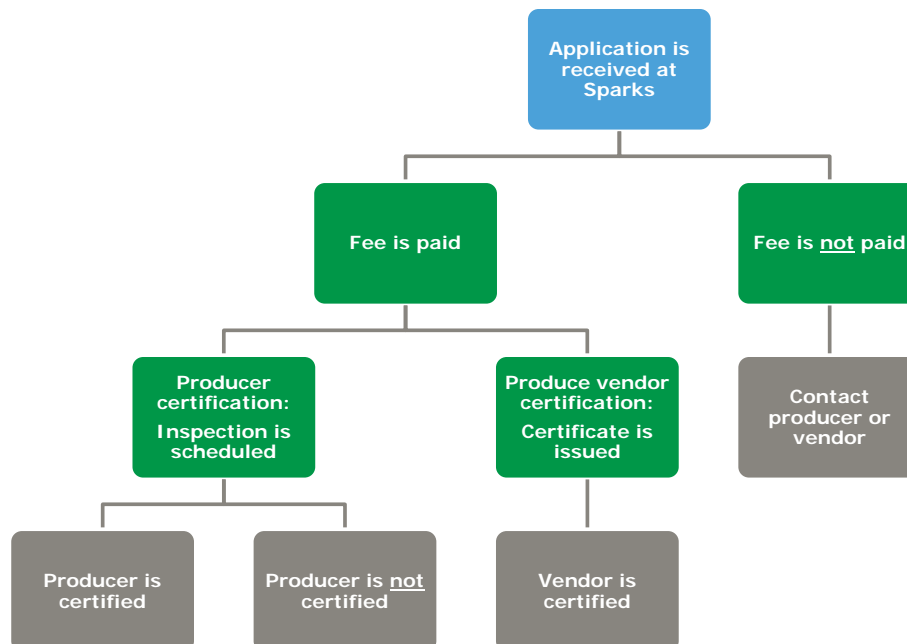
- **Produce vendor requirements:**
 - Can be used to sell another producers product
 - If you posses a Producer Certificate, you do not need to pay for a Vendor Certificate.
 - You may still request or be issued one
