



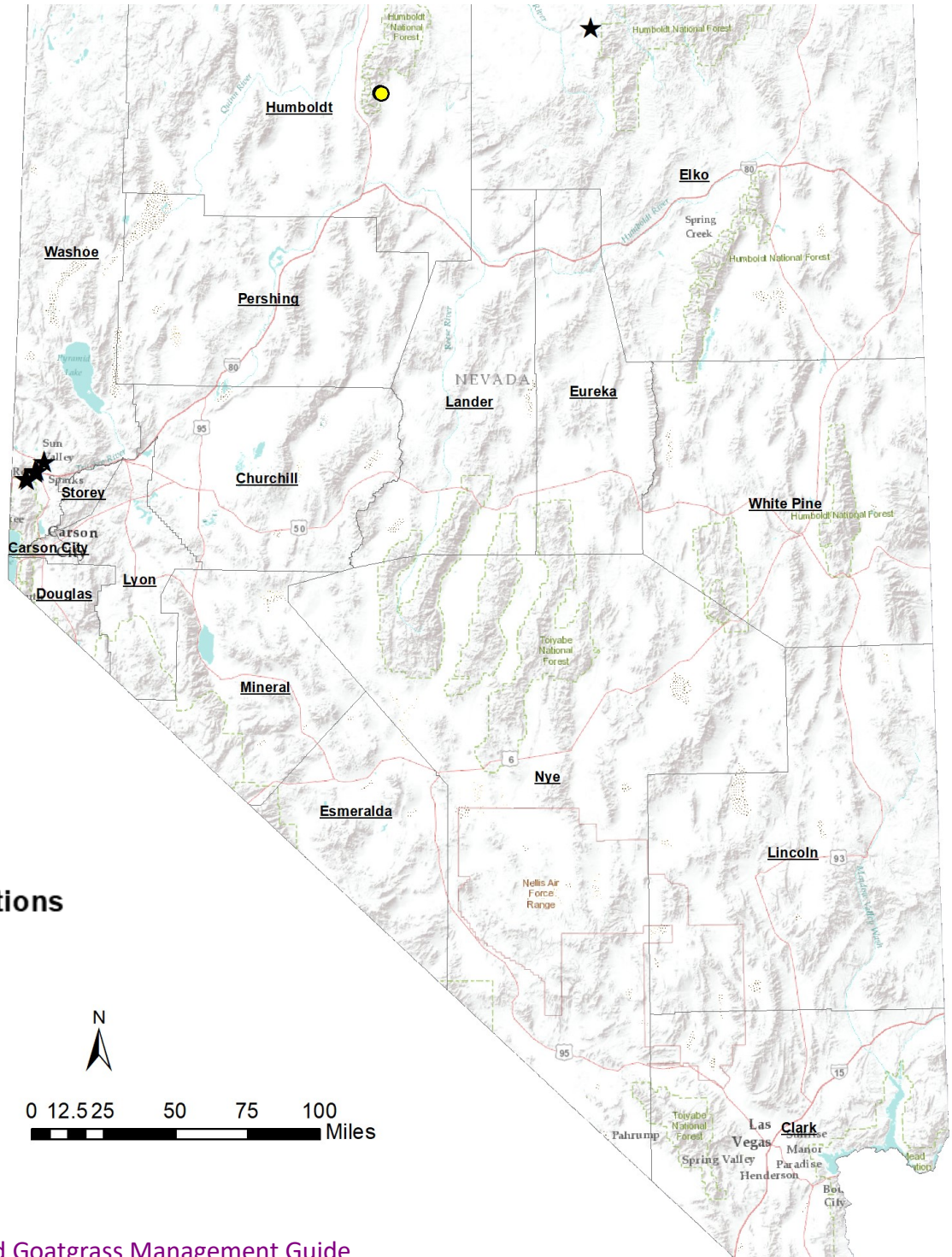
# Jointed Goatgrass in Nevada



Jointed Goatgrass (often referred to as Jointgrass) is a non-native winter annual grass which can spread rapidly. Jointed Goatgrass is closely related to other wheat species and is often a contaminant in winter wheat seed. This grass may reduce wheat quality and yields if introduced in agricultural fields, and may negatively affect native rangelands.

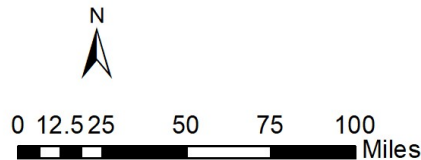
## Jointed Goatgrass Locations
