Guidance for Food Distribution Sites during COVID-19 Pandemic

This guidance is based on what is currently known about the transmission and severity of COVID-19 and information made available by Nevada Health Response. The Nevada Department Agriculture (NDA) will update this guidance as needed and as additional information becomes available. Local agencies may have additional guidance and/or requirements regarding these operations in their jurisdiction.

Recommended Precautions for Food Distribution Sites

Food distribution has been deemed "essential" under <u>Governor Sisolak's directives</u>. As the risk of transmission of COVID-19 remains high, it is important for community organizations operating food distribution to take steps to reduce the risk of transmission between clients, staff and volunteers.

Food Distribution Guidance

Social distancing

- Require all staff, volunteers and clients to maintain at least six feet of space between individuals.
- Implement line spacing guidance for clients.
- Offer drive-thru distributions and/or pre-packed take out distributions.

Cleaning and using protective equipment

- Clean all contact surfaces frequently.
- Application of <u>Guidelines for Safe Food Handling During COVID-19 Outbreak</u> is recommended.
- Staff should wash hands often with warm water and soap or use an alcohol-based gel.
- Staff should wear single-use protective gloves if possible. Staff should always wash their hands prior to putting on gloves and after removing them.
- Staff and volunteers should avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth.
- Site staff should wear <u>face coverings</u> at all times and should refrain from touching the covering.
- Sites are encouraged to post signage reminding clients to wash their hands after attending a food distribution.

Monitoring illness

- Monitor staff and volunteers for signs of illness such as shortness of breath, coughing or fever.
- Anyone experiencing signs of illness should stay home, contact their healthcare provider and follow CDC-recommended steps.
- If anyone becomes sick, the facility should:
 - o Close off areas used by the sick person.

- Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the area. Wait 24 hours (or as long as possible) before you clean or disinfect.
- o Clean and disinfect all areas used by the sick person, such as offices, bathrooms, common areas, and shared electronic equipment like tablets and computers.

Communication

- If a meal distribution site is impacted by COVID-19, the site should notify the NDA immediately.
- If an Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) or Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) distribution site is impacted by COVID-19, the site should notify the food bank or CSFP agency which must then notify the NDA.
