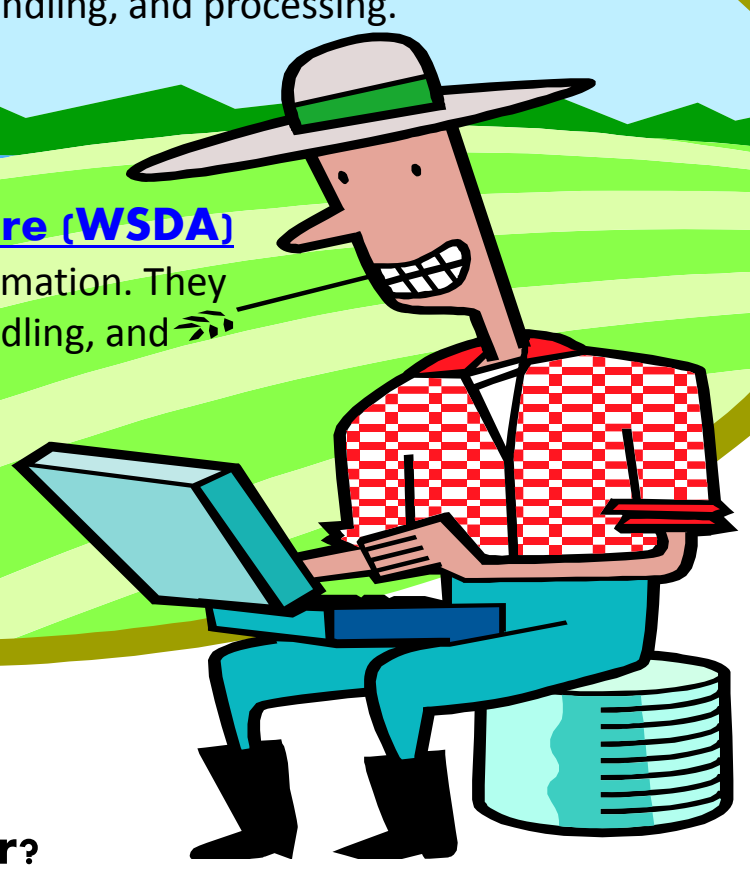

The US has equivalency agreements with Canada Organic Regime (COR), the European Union (EU), Japan, and Korea. Through these agreements, organic operations certified to the USDA NOP or COR, EU, Japanese or Korean standards may be labeled and sold as organic in both US and the participating country. Be sure to check out the agreements because there may some adjustments to your certified operation that are necessary to meet the requirements of the agreement.
